

CITY COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

A regular meeting of the Beach City Council was called to order by Mayor Walter Losinski at 7:00 pm March 19, 2012. Present when the meeting was called to order was Council Henry Gerving, Tim Marman, Mark Benes, Jeanne Larson, Wade Walworth, Public Works Supt. Dell Beach, City Auditor Kimberly Nunberg and guests Jon Wilczek, Jim Fulton and Charles Fulton.

**Employees Meeting:**

PWS Beach reported street repairs will start soon and sweeping streets has already begun. PACE was here last week to clean and camera a number of sewer lines. All part time summer employees will be returning at the end of May.

**Committee Reports:**

Larson reported on the City and County Zoning meetings held today. Mayor Losinski, Gerving and Larson reported on the Crew Camp Workshop they recently attended in Dickinson.

**New Business:**

Charles and Jim Fulton requested the city consider changing the drainage ditch that goes through their property in Woodhull's Second Addition, Block 2, Lots 1-6. Mayor Losinski explained the city installed the drainage ditch nearly 15 years ago when the city owned the property to correct drainage issues in the area and there is an easement for the drainage ditch. Discussion. The Street Committee will review other options which may be available; however, any costs associated with improvements would be the responsibility of the property owner. There was discussion on establishing a fine for vehicles being operated off of the truck route which exceed a number 3 restriction. Marman moved to establish a fine of \$100 for vehicles which exceed number 3 restriction being operated off of the truck route, second by Walworth. Motion carried unanimously. Nunberg read a letter from the Golden Valley County Fair Board requesting approval to discharge fireworks during the County Fair and Centennial Celebration. Larson moved to approve the request, second by Gerving. Gerving – yes, Marman – no, Benes – yes, Larson – yes, Walworth – yes. Motion carried.

No other business was brought forward. Walworth moved to adjourn, second by Larson. Motion carried unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 8:00 p.m.
