Ranisate has been coordinating with representatives from BNSF on work responsibility breakdown and crossing rehab. The crossing rehab would be a 50/50 split between the City and BNSF. Public Works Report

PWS Dietz reported on projects being completed. More than 60 blocks of sewer main were cleaned during the month of October.

Auditor's Report

Gaugler reviewed her written report. Special assessments have been certified to the County Auditor. Street Infrastructure Loans payments at the Bank of North Dakota have been made. As of October 31st, expenses for the year are \$7,193,178.36 and revenues are \$7,038,629.95. The final report for the USDA RBDG project at Dobre Brewhouse was submitted October 30th.

Gaugler reviewed the year-to-date financial statement. Zachmann moved to approve the following budget amendments, second by Swanson-Puckett. Motion carried unanimously.

- Amend General Fund - Arts Across the Prairie from \$0 to \$52,250 for grant funds received and expended for the Arts Across the Prairie project.
- Amend City Sales Tax - Infrastructure Fund from \$400,000 to \$500,00 due to expenses incurred for the Beach Dam Project, 2nd Street Crossing Project and 2026 Main Street and Central Avenue Reconstruction Project.
- Amend Water Fund - Legal Fees from \$0 to \$15,080 for expenses incurred with the 2025 Street and Utility Improvement Project.
- Amend Water Fund – Engineering Fees from \$0 to \$300,000 for expenses incurred with the 2025 Street and Utility Improvement Project.

- Amend Water Fund – Construction Bid from \$4,799,920 to \$4,860,000 for increased expenses incurred with the 2025 Street and Utility Improvement Project.
- Amend Water Fund – Repairs from \$25,000 to \$50,000 due to increased expenses.

New Business

Correspondence was read from BMO regarding the sale of the local branch to First Citizen's Bank. The completion of the sale is expected to be completed mid-2026.

Thank you correspondence was read from Beach Post Grad Party 2025.

ORDINANCE NO. 399

AN ORDINANCE ENACTING A NEW SECTION 19.0707-1 TO THE CITY CODE OF THE CITY OF BEACH, NORTH DAKOTA RELATING TO ZONING OF CERTAIN PROPERTIES;

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEACH, NORTH DAKOTA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: Section 19.0707-1 entitled "Properties from R-1 to C-2" is hereby enacted as follows:

19.0707 Properties from R-1 to C-2:

19.0707-1: Lots 7, 8, 9, in Block 3, Hunter's 3rd Addition to the City of Beach, Golden Valley County, North Dakota

Section 2: Repeal of Ordinances in Conflict. All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3: Severability. In the event any section of this Ordinance is held invalid by court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity shall extend only to the section affected, and other sections of this Chapter shall continue in full force and effect.

Section 4: Effective Date: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after final passage.

1. The governing body of the City of Beach has hereby found, determined, and declared it to be necessary and desirable for the City to improve streets and incidentals as described in Resolution 2025-21, and the detailed plans and specifications discussed therein, concerning the City of Beach Stormwater Drainage Improvement District No. 2025-03.
2. The Preliminary Engineering Report prepared by the City Engineer recommends roadway and utility improvements consisting of utility work, drainage improvements, grading, repairing soft spots, in the project area. The purpose of this project is for new installation of storm sewer infrastructure to alleviate flooding near Main Street. The estimated project cost is \$1,259,000 and one approximately \$59,000, or Four and seven tenths percent (4.7%) of the project cost will be paid with special assessments levied to the benefitted property owners, and the remainder of the cost being funded through grant and/or City funding. The improvement District includes all properties located within the District boundaries, as shown on the attached map.
3. The owners of the property liable to be specially assessed for said improvements may file written protests with the City Auditor PO Box 278, Beach ND 58621, against the said improvements within thirty (30) days after the first publication of this resolution. The City Council shall at its next meeting after the expiration of said period, on January 5, 2026, or such other date as determined by the City Council, to meet at Beach City Hall, for the purpose of hearing and determining the sufficiency of any protests so filed and of taking any such further action with respect to said improvements as may then be deemed necessary and expedient.

IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 2025-04, CITY OF BEACH, NORTH DAKOTA**

BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the City of Beach, North Dakota (the “City”), as follows:

1. The governing body of the City of Beach has hereby found, determined, and declared it to be necessary and desirable for the City to improve streets and incidentals as described in Resolution 2025-22, and the detailed plans and specifications discussed therein, concerning the City of Beach Street Improvement District No. 2025-04.
2. The Preliminary Engineering Report prepared by the City Engineer recommends roadway and utility improvements consisting of approximately 8,300 LF of full roadway reconstruction, 1,520 LF of mill and overlay, along with chip sealing, intermittent curb and gutter, sidewalk, valley gutter, and driveway improvements and replacements and related work. The streets within this district either exceeded their usable life and need to be reconstructed or the asphalt pavement is at a critical point where the proposed maintenance application can extend the life of the pavement. The estimated project cost is \$8,818,280 and one approximately \$4,489,880, or Fifty one percent (51%) of the project cost will be paid with special assessments levied to the benefitted property owners, and the remainder of the cost being funded through grant funding. The improvement District includes all properties located within the District boundaries, as shown on the attached map.
3. The owners of the property liable to be specially assessed for said improvements may file written protests with the City Auditor PO Box 278, Beach ND 58621, against the said improvements within thirty (30) days after the first publication of this resolution. The City Council shall at its next meeting after the expiration of said period, on January 5, 2026, or such other date as determined by the City Council, to meet at Beach City Hall, for the purpose of hearing and determining the sufficiency of any protests so filed and of taking any such further action with respect to said improvements as may then be deemed necessary and expedient.
4. That the City Auditor is hereby authorized and directed to cause this resolution, including a map of the Improvement District boundaries, showing the proposed improvement district, to be published once each week for two consecutive weeks in the official newspaper of the City.

Monday, November 17th, 2025

1. The NDLC held a webinar on "Public Comment Policy Guidance", Thursday, November 6th. If anyone is interested in reviewing the materials presented, please let me know and they will be emailed to you.
 2. The Golden Valley County Tax Sale is Tuesday, November 18th at 10am.
 3. Renewal leases have been provided to current lease holders at the mini mall.
 4. The ND Dept. of Commerce Rural Catalyst Grant Program application deadline is January 7th. The purpose of the Rural Catalyst Grant program is to support quality of life improvements and economic development projects for rural communities in the state. This is a reimbursable grant up to \$500,000 (1:1 match). The total project cost may include the direct costs associated with:
 - Slum/blight removal and/or remediation
 - Community health and wellness project
 - Expansion or new business project that addresses a critical need in the area of: quality of life improvement, economic development projects, education, or health/wellness
 - Preserving or opening a rural grocery store
 - Libraries
 - Placemaking, vibrancy, and downtown improvement area projects
 - Museums
 - Recreation-related projects
 - Transportation
- We have been approached to be the sponsor of an application. There is no financial commitment for the city if we sponsor the application. Your approval is needed to proceed.
5. City offices were closed on November 11th, for Veteran's Day and will be closed on November 27th for Thanksgiving, as well as, November 28th.
 6. As required by the Federal Lead and Copper Rule Revisions, Category B Phase 1, letters notifying customers of the type of water service line (lead, galvanized, or unknown) were mailed to customers on November 12th. The Certification of Service Line Notification Delivery was returned to ND Department of Environmental Quality on November 13th.
 7. As of November 14th, expenses for the year are \$7,316,757.56 and revenues collected are \$7,289,514.98. Ninety-five percent (95%) of the amended expense budget has been spent.
 8. On December 4th, ND Department of Commerce is offering a webinar titled "Overcoming Barriers & Building Housing in Rural ND." I plan to participate and if anyone else would like me to register them please let me know.
 9. Renewal applications for retail alcoholic beverage license have been provided to the current license holders. The applications will be presented for your review at the December 15th meeting.

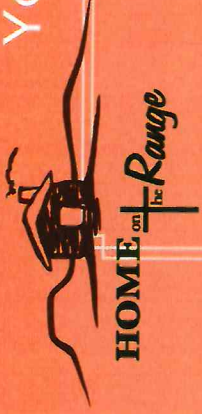

Dear customer,

Each year, Southwest Water Authority (SWA) carefully analyzes current and future financials to determine the following year's budget and any need for rate changes. It is done with the understanding that future rates must reflect the expenses necessary to help assure continued water quality and reliable flows to all of SWA's customers. There are many fixed costs to consider, such as utilities, fuel, cathodic protection, treatment chemicals, salaries, training, insurance, building expenses, vehicle expenses, system maintenance, and equipment replacement.

After extensive review of projected income and expenses at the November board meeting, SWA's Board of Directors approved water rate increases will be passed along to the customer. The following rates are effective January 1, 2026:

Contract	\$5.87	\$5.92
Demand	\$7.29	\$7.39
Raw	\$4.67	\$4.72
Industrial/SWA Depot	\$12.00	\$12.00
PCRWS	\$4.45	\$4.45

- The capital repayment portion of the water rate is tied to the August 31, 2025 Consumer Price Index, which was 2.92%. The 2026 rate for capital repayment will increase from \$1.51 to \$1.56 per 1,000 gallons.
- The replacement and extraordinary maintenance portion will increase from \$0.89 to \$0.97 per 1,000 gallons. This increase will be absorbed by SWA.

The State Water Commission (SWC) has until February 13, 2026 to notify SWA of their approval or if they have any changes to the 2026 O&M Budget. The supporting details that determined the rates are also available for your review. If there are any SWC changes, you will be notified.
