A regular meeting of the Beach City Council was called to order by Mayor Henry Gerving on September 3, 2019 at 7:00 pm. Present when the meeting was called to order was City Council Tim Marman, Andy Zachmann, Bev Wolff, Jeanne Larson, Public Works Superintendent Randy Dietz, City Auditor Kimberly Gaugler, Engineer Jasper Klein, guests Deb Helsper, Samuel Kerr, Amanda Miller, and Marcus Knutson.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Roll call was taken. Benes and Walworth were absent.

Mayor Gerving called for additions to the agenda. BHS Pep Club & Homecoming Advisors Amanda Miller and Sam Kerr asked to be added to the agenda. Mayor Gerving approved the request.

Public Works Report

Dietz reviewed his written report. Larson moved to rescind the motion to enter a contract for crushing the concrete at the old landfill, second by Wolff. Motion carried unanimously. Dietz provided an estimate for storm drain and gutter repairs to the intersection at First Street and Second Ave SW and sidewalk replacement on First Street between First Avenue SW and Second Avenue SW. Marman moved to seek additional estimates for the proposed work, second by Larson. Motion carried unanimously. Dietz suggested starting a policy to waive landfill fees for disposal of dilapidated buildings. An Application to Waive Fees for a Dilapidated Building was reviewed by Mayor and City Council. Zachmann moved to approve the policy and application, second by Marman. Motion carried unanimously. Dietz explained the oil distributor is in need of repair so the city crew is not able to do any chip sealing this year. Marman moved to order

additional dura patch material for street maintenance and have the oil distributor repaired, second by Wolff. Motion carried unanimously.

Proposed Ordinance 386 was reviewed. Gaugler provided correspondence from Attorney Bouray recommending Section 40 not be removed. Larson moved to follow the City Attorney's recommendation and reinsert Section 40 into Proposed Ordinance 386, second by Wolff.

Zachmann – yes, Wolff – yes, Larson – yes, Marman – no. Motion carried. The First Reading of Ordinance 386 will be presented at the next regular meeting.

New Business

Applications for Special Event submitted by 3rd Avenue Liquor were reviewed. Zachmann moved to approve the Special Events, second by Larson. Motion carried unanimously.

Correspondence from Church of St. John the Baptist was read. Marman moved to approve the request to extend the handicap parking area on the South side of the church, second by Wolff. Motion carried unanimously.

No other business was brought forward. Mayor Gerving adjourned the meeting. Meeting adjourned at 7:35 p.m.
