### **Public Works Report**

PWS Dietz reviewed his written report. Dietz recommended having the City Engineer develop a plan to address the drainage issues on 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue NE between 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Street. A plan for improvements to the alley between Central and First Avenue SE was reviewed. Benes moved to present the plan with cost to the property owners affected, second by Wolff. Motion carried unanimously. A request was received to establish a 10 minute loading/unloading zone on Central Avenue between Main Street and First Street S. Benes moved to approve creating a 10 minute loading/unloading zone on Central Avenue that would accommodate a commercial van, second by Wolff. Motion carried unanimously.

### **Auditor Report**

Gaugler reviewed her written report.

### **Engineers Report**

Engineer Klein's written report was reviewed. A Public Information Meeting for the 2021 Street and Utility Project is being planned for June 15<sup>th</sup> between 5 – 7 pm.

### **Committee Reports**

**Street Committee** – Benes proposed a plan to change the alley on Woodhull's 2<sup>nd</sup> Addition, Block 3. The plan would be to vacate the existing alley and establish a new alley that would adjoin the alley on Block 4. The two alleys would then make an L shape. All adjoining property owners on Block 3 are in agreement and will cover expenses related to making the change. Benes moved to support the process to vacate the alley, second by Walworth. Gaugler mentioned NDCC 40-39 outlines the process for vacating an alley. Larry Sabo commented in opposition of vacating the alley. Roll call vote – Zachmann abstained since he is one of the property owners requesting the alley change, Benes – yes, Walworth – yes, Larson – yes, Wolff – yes, Marman – no. Motion carried.

### **New Business**

Benes moved to approve Resolution 2020-12, second by Walworth. Motion carried unanimously.

**RESOLUTION 2020-12**

**A RESOLUTION SETTING AUDITOR BOND LIMIT FOR THE CITY OF BEACH,  
NORTH DAKOTA**

WHEREAS, the City of Beach is covered by a blanket bond by the North Dakota State Bond Fund; and,

WHEREAS, the North Dakota State Bonding Fund provides fidelity bond coverage for city employees and public officials in dealing with public funds; and,

WHEREAS, the bond is fixed by the city governing body and set by resolution as outlined in NDCC §40-13-02; and,

WHEREAS, at the June 1, 2020 regular city council meeting of the Beach City Council the current bond limits were reviewed and found to be sufficient.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Beach, North Dakota, that the Auditor Bond coverage by the State Bonding Fund in the amount of Seven Hundred Eighty-three Thousand Seven Hundred Eighty-nine (\$783,789) has been reviewed and found sufficient.
